## Drawing Zoning Site Plans

-Larger commercial projects normally involve a Professional Engineer who can provide the necessary site plan as required by Zoning.
-For smaller projects that do not involve a Professional Engineer, a Zoning Site Plan may still be drawn professionally by a Registered Land Surveyor.
-Projects that don't require the services of a Professional Engineer or Surveyor can be drawn by the property owner or builder, etc.
-Zoning Site Plans are not required to be drawn professionally. They may be drawn by hand using a pencil, scale or ruler and a straight edge (such as a ruler). Scales of $1 "=20$ ', $1^{\prime \prime}=40^{\prime}$ and $1^{\prime \prime}=60^{\prime}$ are provided below. Simply print this page and cut out the scale that you wish to work with.

- Grid paper may be purchased at your local office supply store or you may print the following page and use it as grid paper.
-If you have an extra copy of your property plat, you may use that to draw the proposed activity and other Site Plan Requirements as long as it is of a scale as described in the Site Plan Requirements.
-Whether drawn professionally or by hand, all Zoning Site Plans must meet the Site Plan Requirements as shown on the APPLICATION FOR ZONING/LANDSCAPE SITE PLAN REVIEW FOR COMMERCIAL PROJECTS and be submitted in conjunction with the application.We can not accept faxed versions of site plans since the fax transmission will not hold the original scale.
