Colleton County Council met on Tuesday, March 2, 2021 at 6:00 PM, Virtually. Steven Murdaugh called the meeting to order with Council Members Dr. Joseph Flowers, Art Williams, Gene Whetsell Phillip Taylor in attendance (via zoom)

Mr. Taylor gave the invocation and led the Pledge of Allegiance.

### **Approval of Minutes**

Regular Meeting January 5, 2021

A motion to approve the minutes was made by Dr. Flowers and seconded by Mr. Taylor.

The motion carried unanimously.

### **Appearances & Public Presentations**

Southern Carolina Alliance Quarterly Report – Mr. Brantley Strickland gave an overview of all of the activities for 2020.

In his Name Lowcountry Shelter – Mr. Stacey Sea (?) gave an overview of what they do at the present time and what additional services they have projected and need for the future.

Mr. Murdaugh said one of the items on executive session is the Coroner. He will not be here this evening so I was going to make a motion to amend the agenda to remove Item "a" under item 13 (executive session) a personnel matter with the Coroner. Dr. Flowers seconded the motion.

The motion carried unanimously.

### Administrator's Briefing

Mr. Griffin said he had a few items, but much more detail information in your council report. We are starting to get a little clearer picture of where we are overall with our revenues this year. Obviously they have been hard to chart because of Covid situation and what impacts we have around the county in that situation. It's actually a little brighter picture than we anticipated. The overall county revenues actually continued to track our budget amounts that we have had for the year. We are still seeing some fluctuation in our sales taxes. We also have a Capitol Project real estate offset sales tax that has

fluctuated a little bit, but our actual overall real property is coming in a little bit ahead of where we were. Obviously we are going to be looking in the next month or so to see what the State plans to do with their budget regarding the revenue fact down to the counties and the changes that were made there overall with our local government fund last year that were not implemented this year. I also would like to compliment our department heads and elected officials on the expenditure side we are actually, our expenses are 95% of what they were last year at this time. They have really done a good job of buckling down and that is really impressive thinking of the fact that all the things we have had to do with Covid. The additional things with the PPE with the dividers and protective devises within the offices and the additions we have had to do there. Really impressed and appreciate those folks in taking it seriously as we have moved along.

The governor announced this morning that Phase 1B will go into effect for vaccinations on Monday. Had a call with David Greene and our folks at Fire-Rescue & EMD this morning and we are working on a plan both with the hospital and DHEC now to try to get started as soon as possible in the next few weeks vaccinations both for our county teachers and our county employees that are eligible under this new phase of vaccination rounds. Hopefully we will have more information on that for you very soon. We will work those plans into here in the next few days.

I will probably get some information back out to you later on this month because we have been approached again by the Technical College of the Lowcountry. They are interested in a new training agreement at the Careers Skill Center. As you know we feel real good with the agreement we have now with both LCOG and Palmetto Training there, but it appears that TCL is trying to work agreement with Palmetto Training to provide similar training, but the just got that information late last week, so don't have enough to assess it and get some information back out to you, but hopefully we will have such sometime next week or two. We are planning right now about having our 1st budget workshop the end of March, 1st part of April. I imagine that will likely be an item on the agenda then for discussion.

Mr. Murdaugh said he had a question not related to what you were talking about. When they start the demolition on the building are they going to close that parking lot in front of the Harrelson Building also? How will the people access in and out?

Mr. Griffin said actually it is a phase plan. They will be closing that and they are also going to close Jefferies down for a day or two. They have got to because that building actually goes right up to the road. A portion of it may even go up under the road they are not sure, but they've got some plans in place to reinforce and handle that, but they will actually have to shut down Jefferies Blvd. for a little while to get that front portion down.

### **RESOLUTION NO. 21-R-10**

### COUNCIL-ADMINISTRATOR FORM OF GOVERNMENT FOR COLLETON COUNTY

[A Resolution Creating a Capital Projects Sales Tax Commission in Regards to a Proposed One-Percent Capital Project Sales Tax.]

### WHEREAS:

- 1. Colleton County Council wishes to provide voters with the opportunity to vote on the funding of capital projects through a Capital Project Sales Tax for a period of eight years pursuant to §§ 4-10-300 et seq., of the South Carolina Code of Laws, 1976, as amended: and
- 2. Colleton County Council is authorized by the Capital Project Sales Tax Act to create by resolution a commission, composed of six members, to investigate and propose capital projects of the type specified in §4-10-330 of the South Carolina Code of Laws, 1776, as amended, and to formulate a referendum ballot question to be approved by County Council and presented to the voters of Colleton County at the general election to be held in November 2022.

# NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COLLETON COUNTY COUNCIL DULY ASSEMBLED THAT:

- 1. There is hereby created, pursuant to §4-10-320 of the Capital Project Sales Tax act, a commission (the "Commission") to exercise all powers granted to commissions under the Capital Project Sales Tax Act.
- 2. The County Council shall, by June 15, 2021, appoint three members to the commission.
- 3. The municipalities in the County must appoint three additional members of the Commission, who must be residents of the incorporated municipalities within the County, and who are selected in accordance with §4-10-320 of the Capital Project Sales Tax Act, according to the following mechanism:
  - a. The total population of all incorporated municipalities within the county, as determined by the most recent United States census, must be divided by three, the result being an apportionate average.
  - **b.** The respective population of each municipality in the county must be divided by the apportionate average to determine an appointive index.
  - c. Each municipality in the county appoints a number of members to the commission equal to the whole number indicated by their appointive index. However, no single

municipality may appoint more than two members to the commission; unless there is only one municipality in the county, and in such case the municipality is entitled to three appointments to the commission.

- d. When less than three members are selected to the commission in accordance with the prescribed appointive index method, the remaining member or members must be selected in a joint meeting of the commission appointees of the municipalities in the county. The member or members must be chosen from among the residents of the municipalities in the county that before this time have not provided a representative for the commission.
- e. In the event no municipality is entitled to appoint a member to the commission pursuant to the formula in subitem (c) of this subsection, the municipality with the highest appointive index must be deemed to have an appointive index of one.

Based upon the foregoing methodology, the City of Walterboro is entitled to appoint two members to the Commission. Those two members of the Commission are authorized to select the sixth and final member of the Commission. The final member of the Commission must be a resident of a municipality located in the County other than the City of Walterboro.

A certified copy of this Resolution shall be delivered to the City of Walterboro upon adoption. By adopting this resolution, the Council requests that the City of Walterboro appoints two members of the Commission, and that they notify the Council of such appointments.

- 4. The Commission created pursuant to the Capital Project Sales Tax act shall consider proposals for funding capital projects within the County area. The Commission shall then formulate the referendum question that is to be submitted to County Council for approval to appear on the ballot, in accordance with §4-10-330(D) of the Capital Project Sales Tax Act.
- 5. The Commission shall consider funding only the following types of projects:
  - a. highways, roads, streets, bridges, and public parking garages and related facilities;
  - b. courthouses, administration buildings, civic centers, hospitals, emergency medical facilities, police stations, fire stations, jails, correctional facilities, detention facilities, libraries, coliseums, educational facilities under the direction of an area commission for technical education, or any combination of these projects;
  - c. cultural, recreational, or historic facilities, or any combination of these facilities;
  - **d.** water, sewer, or water and sewer projects;
  - e. flood control projects and storm water management facilities;
  - f. beach access and beach renourishment;
  - g. dredging, dewatering, and constructing spoil sites, disposing of spoil materials, and other matters directly related to the act of dredging;

- h. jointly operated projects of the county, a municipality, special purpose district, and school district, or any combination of those entities, for the projects delineated in subitems (a) through (g) of this item
- i. any combination of the projects described in subitems (a) through (h) of this item;
- 6. The Commission shall propose the date of termination of the tax. The maximum time, in two-year increments not to exceed eight years from the date of imposition.
- 7. The Commission shall solicit proposals for proposed capital projects from the Council and from each of the municipalities and special purpose districts within the County, and from community groups, businesses, utilities and private citizens, and the like and is authorized and encouraged to advertise and hold public hearings to discuss' such projects.
- 8. In order to provide guidance to the Commission, the Council has attached as Exhibit A to this resolution a suggested timetable for the work of the Commission. County administrative personnel will assist in arranging the necessary advertising, in providing legal and clerical assistance, and in making available space in County buildings for public hearings and Commission meetings.
- 9. The Commission is requested to accept for funding only those capital projects which reliable estimates of cost have been provided. Such estimates should include all costs to be funded from the Capital Project Sales Tax, including, but not limited to, architectural and engineering fees, construction management fees, cost of any real property necessary for the capital project, legal fees, and should include a contingency for cost overruns and inflation. Similarly, the Commission is requested to accept for funding only those capital projects that the construction of which is reasonably expected to commence within nine months after funds are made available therefor.
- 10. The Commission shall make its recommendations, including the form of the ballot question to be approved by County Council and presented to the voters in accordance with § 4-10-330(D) of the Capital Project Sales Tax Act, to Council no later than May 9, 2022.

### WHEREAS:

- 1. The County advertised a Request for Bids, CTC-20 2021 Dirt Road Rocking Project for dirt road rocking and drainage improvements; and
- 2. Twelve companies responded to the Request for Bids, CTC-20; and
- 3. The County evaluated the bids and certifies that procurement was handled correctly according to the Colleton County Purchasing Policy, and recommends the contract be awarded to Edisto Contracting, LLC, on behalf of the CTC; and
- 4. Funding for this project is provided by the Colleton Transportation Committee.

### NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COLLETON COUNTY COUNCIL **DULY ASSEMBLED THAT:**
