COLLETON COUNTY CONFIRMS FIRST CASE OF COVID-19

DATE: March 21, 2020

This morning, at 9:30 AM, DHEC notified Colleton County officials of the first case of COVID-19 in a Colleton County resident. While DHEC has notified the County of a confirmed case of COVID-19, DHEC is limited in the information that they can provide.

Colleton County residents are urged to follow the guidance of Governor McMaster and the recommendations of the CDC.

REMINDERS AND HELPFUL LINKS
