COLLETON COUNTY COVID-19 UPDATE

The Colleton Health Department will offer a first dose vaccination clinic on March 31st, 2021, from 7:30 AM until 7:15 PM. There will be a corresponding second dose clinic 28 days following each first dose clinic. Individuals can sign up at <u>https://cvas.dhec.sc.gov</u> or see all available vaccination appointments at <u>www.scdhec.gov/vaxlocator</u>.

Individuals in Phase 1b can make vaccine appointments. Phase 1b includes individuals aged 55 and older, individuals with increased risk for severe COVID-19 disease, frontline workers with increased occupational risk, individuals at increased risk in settings where people are living and working in close contact and all workers in health care and community health settings who have routine, direct patient contact and were not vaccinated in phase 1a.

Walterboro Family Care (457 Spruce St., Walterboro) is providing vaccines. You can register with Walterboro Family Care by calling their office at 843-781-7428. They will register you in VAMS (which requires an email address) and then VAMS will email you a registration link that you can use to register for the Walterboro Family Care vaccination site (or any other vaccination sites statewide).
