COLLETON COUNTY SCHOOL DISTRICT FEEDING UPDATE, FIFTEEN CASES OF COVID-19 IN COLLETON COUNTY

Colleton County School District will be observing Spring Break April 13th through April 17<sup>th</sup>.

During the week of April 13-17, Colleton County School District will NOT be making meal deliveries, but Colleton County Government will be operating mobile meal pick-up locations for students during the Spring Break period. Colleton County officials have been notified of fifteen total cases of COVID-19 in Colleton County, These cases of COVID-19 are in the 29488, 29446, 29475, 29435 and 29929 ZIP codes. Also, DHEC isn't notified when individuals are no longer infectious (i.e., they are well), and as a result, these numbers likely include people who have recovered and no longer pose a risk to others.
