COLLETON COUNTY COVID-19 UPDATE

Governor Henry McMaster and the South Carolina Department of Health and Environmental Control (DHEC) announced last week that all South Carolinians aged 16 and older will be eligible to receive the COVID-19 vaccine beginning March 31, 2021.

There will be a Fetter vaccination clinic at Jane Edwards Elementary (1960 Jane Edwards Road, Edisto Island, SC 29438) on Tuesday, April 6, 2021 from 9:00 AM until 2:00 PM.

Walgreens (1326 N. Jefferies Blvd., Walterboro) is providing vaccines for individuals aged 16 and older. You can register with Walgreens at the following URL: https://www.walgreens.com/findcare/vaccination/covid-19.

CVS (555 Robertson Blvd., Walterboro) is providing vaccines for individuals aged 16 and older. You can register with Walgreens at the following URL: https://www.cvs.com/vaccine/intake/store/cvd-schedule?icid=coronavirus-lp-vaccine-sd-statetool

Walterboro Pharmacy LLC (1315 N. Jefferies Blvd., Walterboro) is providing vaccines. You can register by calling (843)782-4050.

Walterboro Family Care (457 Spruce St., Walterboro) is providing vaccines. You can register with Walterboro Family Care by calling their office at 843-781-7428. They will register you in VAMS (which requires an email address) and then VAMS will email you a registration link that you can use to register for the Walterboro Family Care vaccination site (or any other vaccination sites statewide).

SCDHEC will hold another vaccination clinic at the Colleton Health department on April 7th from 9:00 AM until 4:00 PM. Register at https://cvas.dhec.sc.gov/.

"As the supply of vaccines continues to increase, we encourage all Colleton citizens to follow the CDC and SCDHEC recommendations. Don't wait, vaccinate! Both the CDC and FDA concur that all three vaccines currently available are safe and effective in preventing serious illness, hospitalization and death from COVID-19," said Fire-Rescue Chief Barry McRoy. "While the number of cases has declined nationally, statewide, and in our county, it is important to remember that according to the CDC, COVID-19 was the third leading cause of death in the United States in 2020 behind only heart disease and cancer. Getting vaccinated can not only protect you, but may also protect people around you, particularly those with an increased risk for severe illness from COVID-19. Remember, don't wait, vaccinate," McRoy added.
