## NINE CASES OF COVID-19 IN COLLETON COUNTY, DEPARTMENTAL UPDATE

Colleton County officials have been notified of ten total cases of COVID-19 in Colleton County, but only nine current cases, as one of the cases (in the 29488 ZIP code) has recovered. While DHEC has notified the County that four of these cases of COVID-19 are in the 29488 ZIP code, one of the cases is in the 29929 ZIP code, two of the cases are in the 29475 ZIP code and two cases are in the 29435 ZIP code, DHEC is not providing any additional information. There were originally two cases in the 29929 ZIP code, but one of those cases has been allocated to another County, according to DHEC. The ZIP code data for the state is available on DHEC's COVID-19 webpage, specifically on the Testing & SC Data page, underneath the county map. This can be found by following the link below.

It's important to note that there are likely many more people in the community who have this virus and have never been tested. Also, DHEC isn't notified when individuals are no longer infectious (i.e., they are well), and as a result, these numbers likely include people who have recovered and no longer pose a risk to others.

## **GOVERNOR MCMASTER'S EXECUTIVE ORDERS**

Governor McMaster's latest Executive Order states the following:

"I hereby order and direct that effective Tuesday, April 7, 2020, at 5:00 p.m., any and all residents and visitors of the State of South Carolina are required to limit social interaction, practice "social distancing" in accordance with CDC guidance, and take every possible precaution to avoid potential exposure to, and to slow the spread of, COVID-19, and shall limit their movements outside of their home, place of residence, or current place of abode (collectively, "Residence"), except as allowed by this Order, for purposes of engaging in Essential Business, Essential Activities, or Critical Infrastructure Operations, as set forth below and as such terms are further defined herein."

## Colleton County Magistrate Court

Please be advised that by Order of the Chief Justice of the South Carolina Supreme Court dated April 3, 2020 all Magistrate Court jury trials, traffic court, criminal court, civil court and evictions and roll calls are cancelled until further notice to stem the spread of Coronavirus.

The Magistrate's Court will continue to accept civil filings but is not scheduling hearings unless they are an emergency. All filings with the appropriate fees can be dropped off at the Drop Box located at the main entrance to the Magistrate Court at 40 Klein Street, Walterboro between the hours of 8:30 AM and 4:00 PM. Also, all documents can still be submitted by mail to Colleton County Magistrate Court, P.O. Box 1732, Walterboro, SC 29488. Per order of the South Carolina Supreme Court, all filings and documents received by the Magistrate Office will be quarantined for 48 hours before staff may process them. Make sure you enclose a stamped/self-addressed envelope for your receipt and clocked copies. Receipts and any paperwork will be mailed once completed. Staff is available by phone to answer any questions during office hours at (843) 549-1122 for Civil Court or (843) 549-1140 for Traffic Court. While the doors are locked in accordance with our County's emergency protocols, we are accessible by phone during regular office hours of 8:30 AM until 5:00 PM, Monday through Friday.

The Magistrate's Court will also continue to accept fine payments and is encouraging the use of debit/credit cards by paying online with a convenience fee added at www.colletoncounty.org. If

you cannot pay online, we will accept payment in the form of money orders by mail addressed to Colleton County Magistrate Court, P.O. Box 1732, Walterboro, SC 29488. NOTE: Mailed payments will be receipted after the 48-hour quarantine period. Please remember all online payments require up to 3 business days to be processed.

Bond Court will be conducted daily at 10:00 AM through video conferencing. Please contact the court at least one hour prior to the scheduled time to receive instructions on how to view the proceedings.

At this time, the Magistrate's Court is unable to reschedule court dates. When court dates are rescheduled, individuals will receive a written Magistrate Court Summons hearing notice with the new court date, in the mail, at the address the Court has on file. In the meantime, if an individual moves or changes their mailing address, it is their responsibility to notify the court immediately and provide the new mailing address. Failure to provide the new mailing address to the Court could result in a trial being held in their absence.
