Colleton County Government Offices Reopening to the Public on June 15, 2020

Colleton County Government will be reopening offices to the public beginning Monday, June 15th. In our efforts to prevent the spread of COVID-19, we encourage employees and visitors to continue these safe practices:

Maintain social-distancing (specifically, stay 6 feet away from others when you enter a shared space);

DATE: June 12, 2020

Frequently wash your hands or use an alcohol-based hand sanitizer when soap and water are not available;

Individuals are encouraged to wear masks;

Monitor your health, check for fever, and stay home when you're feeling sick.

Before entering County Buildings, individuals must verify the below statements regarding any illness or symptoms related to COVID-19. Individuals must affirm a "no" answer to all three of the statements in order to enter County Buildings.

Have you experienced any new or worsening flu-like symptoms, such as fever (100.4 F or higher), cough, shortness of breath or GI symptoms?

Have you been in close contact with someone under evaluation for COVID-19 or with someone who has a confirmed infection of COVID-19?

Have you, in the last 14 days, traveled or have had family members travel in an airplane or to high-risk areas for the transmission of COVID-19?

If your answer is "yes" to any of the above statements, please return to your vehicle and continue to virtually access Colleton County Government services. Colleton County Memorial Library

The Colleton County Memorial Library has the following restrictions in place related to COVID-19, until further notice.

Due to the additional time needed to properly sanitize and quarantine returning library materials, shelving and additional cleaning of library work spaces, library hours at the Main library will be temporarily limited for the summer. The Library will be open Monday through Friday from 11:00 am - 6:00 pm and on Saturdays 9:00 am - 1:00 pm.

The Cottageville Library will be open on Tuesdays and Thursdays from 4:00 pm - 8:00 pm and on Saturdays from 10:00 am - 5:00 pm.

The Edisto Beach Library will be open on Tuesdays and Thursdays from 1:00 pm - 5:00 pm and on Wednesdays from 10:00 am - 5:00 pm.

Juveniles aged 16 and under must be accompanied by their parent/legal guardian or an adult who assumes direct responsibility for the child while in the library;

The Children's Room, Teen Room, library auditorium and conference room will be off limits for social gatherings at this time. However, a parent with their child may still enter the Teen Room or Children's Room to get a book off the shelves and check them out. Children will not be able to socially gather and stay in those rooms.

There will be limited public computer access. There will be 10 computers available for the public to access the Internet and print out documents. These 10 computers will be reserved on a first come, first served basis with a limit of 30 minutes per use.

Curbside pickup service will still be offered to patrons who are still hesitant about entering the library.

Colleton County Animal Services

The Colleton County Animal Shelter will be open Monday through Friday from 11 am until 3 pm. The Shelter will be open on Saturdays, by appointment only, for adoptions.

Donations of pet food and cat litter only are being accepted during the shelter's public hours. Individuals interested in adopting a pet are encouraged to schedule an appointment by calling 843-893-2651 or by sending an email to <u>ccaec@colletoncounty.org</u>.

Individuals interested in surrendering a pet must call 843-893-2651. Owner surrenders are accepted on a space available basis by appointment only. Residents who have found a stray pet are encouraged to call 843-893-2651 to request a pickup by Animal Control.

Colleton County Animal Services is not accepting feral cats in private traps at this time. Residents who need help with cats must call 843-893-2651 to initiate a visit from Animal Control. Donations of pet food are being accepted during the shelter's public hours.

COLLETON COUNTY COVID-19 UPDATE

Colleton County officials have been notified of 165 total cases of COVID-19 in Colleton County, with 73 current cases. The ZIP code data for the state is available on DHEC's COVID-19 webpage, specifically on the Testing & SC Data page, underneath the county map. This can be found by following the link below.

Unfortunately, DHEC has also announced 16 deaths related to COVID-19 in Colleton County.

DHEC has provided demographic data on nursing homes and extended care facilities that have been impacted by COVID-19. This data shows that Pruitt Health Nursing Home in Walterboro has 32 confirmed COVID-19 resident cases, 10 confirmed COVID-19 staff cases and 10 confirmed COVID-19 resident deaths. Additionally, the Veteran's Victory House Nursing Home has 5 confirmed COVID-19 resident cases, 4 confirmed COVID-19 staff cases and no reported deaths.

Colleton County residents are urged to follow the guidance of Governor McMaster and the recommendations of the CDC. This information can be accessed at colletoncounty.org/coronavirus.

Fetter Health Care Network - Free COVID-19 Testing Site at Bells Elementary

Fetter Health Care Network will offer a free mobile COVID-19 screening and testing site on Thursday, June 18th from 10 am until 3 pm at Bells Elementary School, 12088 Bells Highway, Ruffin, SC. Screening prior to arrival is highly encouraged for faster service.

Individuals who have known COVID-19 exposure or are experiencing cough, fever and shortness of breath can request a screening at <u>FetterCovid19Screening.org</u> or by calling 1-800-365-7410. Residents are asked to wear face coverings and practice safe social distancing while at the mobile testing site.

Tests are given with no out-of-pocket cost to patients. Currently, all insurance providers in South Carolina are covering the full cost of COVID-19 testing. Patient insurance information will be processed during testing. No co-pays or deductibles are being charged. All patients will be served if qualified for the test.
