Fetter Health Care Network & Colleton County Partner to Open Two Additional Free COVID-19 Testing Sites

Fetter Health Care Network and Colleton County have partnered to offer two additional free mobile COVID-19 screening and testing sites. The first will be on Monday, June 8th from 10 a.m. until 3 p.m. at Cottageville Elementary School, 648 Pierce Road, Cottageville, SC. The second will be on Thursday, June 18th from 10 a.m. to 3 p.m. at Bells Elementary School, 12088 Bells Highway, Ruffin, SC. Screening prior to arrival is highly encouraged for faster service.

COLLETON COUNTY COVID-19 UPDATE

Colleton County officials have been notified of 122 total cases of COVID-19 in Colleton County, with 45 current cases. The ZIP code data for the state is available on DHEC's COVID-19 webpage, specifically on the Testing & SC Data page, underneath the county map. This can be found by following the link below.

Unfortunately, DHEC has also announced 14 deaths related to COVID-19 in Colleton County.

This data shows that Pruitt Health Nursing Home in Walterboro has 20 confirmed COVID-19 resident cases, 5 confirmed COVID-19 staff cases and 5 confirmed COVID-19 resident deaths

Colleton County residents are urged to follow the guidance of Governor McMaster and the recommendations of the CDC. This information can be accessed at colletoncounty.org/coronavirus.

Individuals who have known COVID-19 exposure or are experiencing cough, fever and shortness of breath can request a screening at <u>FetterCovid19Screening.org</u> or by calling 1-800-365-7410. Residents are asked to wear face coverings and practice safe social distancing while at the mobile testing site.

Tests are given with no out-of-pocket cost to patients. Currently, all insurance providers in South Carolina are covering the full cost of COVID-19 testing. Patient insurance information will be processed during testing. No co-pays or deductibles are being charged. All patients will be served if qualified for the test.
