Screening prior to arrival is highly encouraged for faster service.

Individuals who have known COVID-19 exposure or are experiencing cough, fever and shortness of breath can request a screening at <u>FetterCovid19Screening.org</u> or by calling 1-800-365-7410. Residents are asked to wear face coverings and practice safe social distancing while at the mobile testing site.

Tests are given with no out-of-pocket cost to patients. Currently, all insurance providers in South Carolina are covering the full cost of COVID-19 testing.
